7. DEVELOPMENT, PLANNING AND ENFORCEMENT- Deputy Mayor Bert Pomeroy

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Pomeroy and seconded by Councillor Dyson-Edmunds to accept the Development and Planning committee report for September as presented. All in favour. Motion carried unanimously.

Recommendations:

i. 587 Churchill Falls Road – The DPE committee recommends Council deny approval of the application from Stephen Gregory for a Seasonal Residential Cottage located at 587 Churchill Falls Road due to the fact that the lot location is not compliant with the Development Regulations in relation to NEF contours which state that no residential development shall be permitted above the NEF 35 contour line as shown on the Land Use Zoning Maps. Moved by Deputy Mayor Pomeroy and seconded by Councillor Crann.

Councillor Compton Hobbs moved that the motion be deferred for further information from NAV Canada. Councillor Dyson-Edmunds seconded the Motion.

There was discussion with respect to the Town's Development Regulations in relation to NEF Contours. Committee agreed to contact NAV Canada for further discussion. All in favour. Motion carried unanimously.

- ii. **Churchill Falls Road Joe Cabot** The DPE committee recommends Council deny the application from Joe Cabot for a storage of industrial material on land owned on Churchill Falls Road due to the fact that approval of this application in a Rural Zone is discretionary and results from the public advertisement showed that there was significant opposition from residents with seasonal cottages in the area. - iii. 398 Kelland Drive-Mom's Place Ltd- The DPE committee recommends Council deny

the application from Mom's Place Ltd for Storage of Heavy Equipment due to the fact that approval of this application in the Commercial Zone is discretionary and it is the opinion of the DPE Committee that the aesthetic look of the area would be compromised. 11. Council Forum

Councillor Baikie said she hopes everyone had a good summer and wished the children a safe, happy and Covid free school year.
