**TO:** Mayor and Council, Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay, Newfoundland and Labrador.

The Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP Detachment responded to a total of 556 occurrences, which were classified as calls for service during March 2026, compared to 538 occurrences in 2025.

A total of 171 persons were incarcerated for a variety of Offences during the month of March

### **Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities**

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2026/2027 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan is currently under development. The APP assigns priorities and goals which help us focus on concerns raised by Detachment Management, Divisional Priorities, and concerns raised by local Stakeholders. The

progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year. The previous years assigned priorities are noted below.

**(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement**

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences.

**(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property**

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

**(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

**\*\*\*\*The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.\*\*\*\***

**Notable Investigations:**

2026292838 – Assaulting a Police Officer – On march 5<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a disturbance. It was advised that the female subject was intoxicated. Members arrived and during the interaction it became known that the subject was involved in a Theft. Members advised the female that she was under arrest and the female assaulted the officer. Members arrested a 29 year old female for Assaulting a Policer, Resist Arrest, Fail to Comply with a Probation Order, and Possession of Stolen Property. The female was brought before court and has been remanded into custody for court at a later date

2026307063 – Sexual Assault – On March 8<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members located and arrested a 48 year old male who was charged with Sexual Assault, Assault Causing Bodily Harm, Resist Arrest, and Two counts of Breaching a court order. The male was brought before the court and was released on conditions to appear at a later date. On March 20<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a disturbance involving the same male. The male was arrested and charged with Assault. He was brought before the court and remanded into custody.

2026333435– Pointing a Firearm – On March 14<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance where it was noted that a male was in possession of a firearm. Members responded and learned that two males had broken into a residence, assaulted a male and threatened him with a weapon. Members were able to locate and arrested a 41 year old male, Craig Best. Best was arrested and charged with Break and Enter, Assault with a Weapon, Robbery, Pointing a Firearm, and Uttering Threats. 35 Year old Samuel Craig Blake was also arrested and charged with Break and Enter, Assault with a weapon, Robbery, and Pointing a Firearm. Two other males were also arrested during this investigation but were released without charges. Both Best and Blake were brought before the court and have been remanded into custody to await further court appearances.

2026335141 – Discharge Firearm – On March 14<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report that there was a male with a long gun lying down in the snow. Members from HVGB, Sheshatshiu, and Police Dog Services immediately attended the area. Members attended and learned a male in the area had killed some wildlife(ptarmigan) in the area and was cleaning it. Member seized the involved firearm and the 36 year old male was charged with Discharging a Firearm within 300m of a Dwelling under the Wildlife Act.

2026332986 – Impaired Operation – On March 14<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP members were on patrol when they conducted a stop with a male travelling on skidoo. The 19 year old was found to be intoxicated and was arrested for Impaired Operation. The male provided breath samples above the legal limit and has been charged with Impaired Operation and Driving over 80mg. The male was also prohibited from driving due to a previous impaired driving conviction and has also been charged with Driving while Prohibited.

2026394175 – Break and Enter – On March 27<sup>th</sup> Members responded to a report of a break and enter at a residence. Members attended and learned a 34 year old male had broke into the residence and damaged property within. Members located and arrested the male who was charged with Break and Enter, Mischief, and several counts of breaching a court order. The male appeared in court and was remanded into custody.

2026398371 – Break and Enter – On March 27<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter. Upon attending a member arrested one suspect, but was then confronted by a second subject who made threats towards the officer. The second suspect was attempting to prevent the officer from taking the first suspect into custody. Additional members arrived on scene and both suspects, along with a third were taken into custody. A 32 year old male is facing two charges of Resisting arrest. A 38 year old male was charged with Uttering Threats, Two Counts of Resist

Arrest, and Breach of a Probation. The 38 year old was brought before court and remanded into custody. The third suspect has been released without charges at this time.

2026412433 – Public Mischief – On March 30<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP received a 911 call involving a reported shooting and a male armed with a firearm. Members from HVGB, SSS, and Police Dog Services responded and found that the report was unfounded and the caller made a false complaint. A 26 year old male was arrested and is facing charged of Public Mischief related to the incident
