Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;
- (2) Crime Reduction Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;
- (3) Community Relations Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

The 2022/2023 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Members will also be looking to conduct ATV Patrols during the summer and Skidoo Patrols during the Winter. During the month of January HVGB RCMP conducted Five(5) checkstops checking for Traffic Infractions and Impaired Drivers. For these checkstops members utilized Mandatory Alcohol Screening testing.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Detachment Commander will also ensure regular contact is maintained and meetings planned with partner agencies to seek opportunities to work together and help resolve any arising issues. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools

****The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.****

Notable Investigations:

202318011 – Assault – On Jan 4th HVGB RCMP responded to a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members learned that Two females had been assaulted by Two males and a female. Members arrested a 35 year old female for two counts of Assault, a 30 year old male for two counts of assault, Fail to Comply with a Court Order, and Resist arrest. A 29 year old male was also arrested for two counts of assault. All matters are before the court.

202314270 – Mischief – On Jan 4th HVGB RCMP responded to a Panic Alarm at a local business. Members attended and learned that a 34 year old male had destroyed property at the business and was still on scene. The male was arrested and has been charged with Mischief.

202323299 – Assault/Fraud – On Jan 6^{th} HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an Assault. Upon attending members learned that a 32 year old male had assaulted a Taxi Driver and refused to pay the fare. The male was arrested and has been charged with Assault and Fraudulently obtain transportation.

202340675 – Assault with a Weapon – On Jan 9^{th} HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members learned that a 23 Year old female had assaulted the home owner with a weapon and fled the area. Members were able to locate the female who has been charged with Assault with a Weapon.

202347389 – Aggravated Assault – On Jan 11th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an violent assault in which the victim was reported to have been assaulted the previous day and was medivcaed to St.John's for Medical Treatment. Upon investigation a 32 Year old male was arrested and charged with 15 offences including Aggravated Assault, Possession of a Weapon, Mischief, B&E, Forcible Confinement et al. The accused was brought before the courts and remanded into custody
