Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2023/2024 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement
Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Members will also be looking to conduct ATV Patrols during the summer and Skidoo Patrols during the Winter.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property
Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community
Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

2023428456 – Impaired Operation – On April 2nd Members responded to a report of a motor vehicle collision. During the course of the investigation members arrested a 24 year old male for Impaired Operation, Obstruction, and Public Mischief

2023437859 – Theft of Motor Vehicle – On April 4th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an altercation between operators of an ATV and a Semi Truck. Upon attending members learned that a 28 year old male had broken into a parked Semi Truck and attempted to steal an ATV. The 28 year old male then confronted the Driver of the Truck and damaged the vehicle. The 28 year old was arrested and charged with Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Mischief Under \$5000(x2), Breach of Probation, and Two Breaches of a Court Order. The male was brought before the courts and remanded into custody.

2023438277 – Assault with a Weapon/Forcible Confinement – On April 9th HVGB RCMP responded to a request for assistance. Members attended a local residence where upon

investigation a 28 year old male was arrested for Assault, Assault with a Weapon, Forcible Confinement, Uttering Threats(X2). The male was charged and brought before the courts.

2023487438 – Assault Causing Bodily Harm – On April 13th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an assault. It was learned that a male and female had been assaulted by a 30 year old female and a 33 year old male. Members arrested the 30 year old female who has been charged with Assault Causing Bodily Harm(X2). The 33 year old male was charged with Assault Causing Bodily Harm(X2) and 7 counts of Breaching a Court Order.

2023503902 – Assault Causing Bodily Harm – On April 16th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a male assaulting a female. Members attended and arrested a 33 year old male for Assault Causing Bodily Harm and Breach of a Probation Order. The male was held in custody and brought before the court.

2023510927 – Break and Enter – On April 18th HVGB RCMP received a report of a B&E. Members attended and upon investigation arrested a 47 year old male who was charged with Break and Enter, Theft Under \$5000, and Breach of a Court Order. He was held for court and later remanded into custody.

2023517177 – Uttering Threats – On April 19th HVGB RCMP responded to a report that a male who had been refused service at a local business then uttered a threat to staff. Members attended and located the 29 year old male suspect. The male attempted to flee from police and resisted arrest. The male has been charged with Uttering Threats and Resist Arrest.

2023534789 – Impaired Operation – On April 22nd HVGB RCMP received a report of an ATV being operated in a dangerous manner. Members attended and located the ATV. Upon conducting a traffic stop members arrested a 68 year old male for impaired operation. The male provided samples over twice the legal limit. The male has been charged with Impaired Operation of a Motor Vehicle

2023538613 – Uttering Threats – On April 23rd HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Members attended and located a 41 year old male who was in breach of a court order. Members arrested the male for breaching his conditions. During the interaction with Police, the male threatened the attending Members. The male has been charged with several counts of breaching his court order and Uttering threats

2023545361 – Assault with a Weapon – On April 24th HVGB RCMP responded to a report that an unknown male was attempting to stab another male. Members attended and located three victims who advised that they had been assaulted by three males and one of the males had a hatchet. Members arrested two 17 year old males and a 19 year old male related to this matter. One of the 17 year old males and the 19 year old male have been charged with Assault. The other 17 year old male has been charged with two counts of Assault with a Weapon, Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose, and Assault. The matters are before the courts
