

MONTHLY POLICING REPORT July 2023 Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP Detachment "B" Division Newfoundland and Labrador





TO: Mayor and Council, Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay, Newfoundland and Labrador.

The Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP Detachment responded to a total of 573 occurrences, which were classified as calls for service during July 2023, compared to 471 occurrences in 2022.

A total of 192 persons were incarcerated for a variety of Offences during the month of July

Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;
- (2) Crime Reduction Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;
- (3) Community Relations Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

The 2023/2024 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Members will also be looking to conduct ATV Patrols during the summer and Skidoo Patrols during the Winter.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

****The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.****

Notable Investigations:

20231000072 – Assault with a Weapon – On July 12^{th} HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an assault. Members attended and arrested a 33 year old male for Assault. Members later learned that the suspect had also threatened the victim with a knife in the residence. Additional charge of Assault with a Weapon was added. Matter is before the courts

20231023385 – Assault with a Weapon – On July 15th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an Assault in Progress. Upon attending members learned that there was two victim who had been assaulted with a weapon. The suspect had fled the area and was not located during patrols. Investigators sought an arrest warrant through the courts and the suspect was later arrested during another incident(20231035105 – Break and Enter). The 31 year old male is facing Three Counts of Assault with a Weapon, Uttering Threats and Breach of a Court Order in relation to this matter.

20231035105 – Break and Enter – On July 17th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter into a shed at a residential property. It was learned that several items had been stolen. Upon investigation HVGB RCMP arrested and charged a 31 year old male in relation to the B&E and Theft. The male was brought before the courts and remanded into custody. The male had an outstanding warrant for charges of Assault and breaching a court order.

20231046443 - Assault with A Weapon – On July 19th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance. Upon arrival members learned that a female had been assaulted by a male, who then took her vehicle. Members were able to locate the 27 year old male who was arrested and charged with Assault with a Weapon, Taking Motor Vehicle without Consent, Assault, Breach of Probation, Breach of Court Order, Mischief, Dangerous Operation of Motor Vehicle, and Driving While Prohibited. The male was held in custody and brought before the court.

20231080346 – Assault Police Officer – On July 25th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a local business where it was reported that the male was attempting to fight people. During the course of Police interaction with the 22 year old male, the male assaulted the responding officer and is facing charges of Assault a Police Officer and Breach of Probation

20231084915 – Public Mischief – On July 26th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an assault. Members attended and located an injured female who indicated she had been assaulted by another male. Members arrested the male but during the course of the investigation it was learned the victim had not been assaulted by the male. The male was subsequently released and the 33 year old female was arrested and is facing a charge of Public Mischief.
