Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2023/2024 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Members will also be looking to conduct ATV Patrols during the summer and Skidoo Patrols during the Winter. Members conducted Eight(8) checkstops during the month of December, conducting alcohol screening. Members also conducted several “Christmas Checkstops” where gifts were handed out to youth in Vehicles.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools. Throughout December members took part in the Annual CBC Turkey drive, Annual Toy Drive, Stuff the Cruiser Event to support Food Bank/Housing Hub, Annual Toys for the North Program to provide toys for kids in coastal communities. Toys arrived on the 18th and members sorted/packed toys on Dec 19th and Air Services began transporting them to coastal Communities to be delivered to local kids.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

20231787406 – Assault With a Weapon – On December 4th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a local business. Upon attending members arrested a 42 year old male on an outstanding warrant. Members also learned that he had assaulted several people. During the arrest the male also assaulted one of the Officers. The male was subsequently arrested and charged with Assault with a Weapon, Assault, and Assaulting a Police Officer, along with the outstanding warrant. The male was brought before the court.

20231803432 – Break and Enter – On December 8th HVGB RCMP responded to a reported Break and Enter at a residence. Members attended and found that a 24 year male had forced entry into the residence and was still present. Members arrested the male who was also breaching release conditions. The male has been charged with B&E and Breach of Conditions.

20231815972 – Assault with a Weapon – On December 11th HVGB RCMP received a report that a male was assaulting a female with a weapon at a residence. Members attended and were advised that the 57 year old male suspect had fled prior to police arrival. Members spoke with the victim and witness on scene. Members were unable to locate the suspect and subsequently applied to the court and obtained an arrest warrant, charging the male with Assault with a Weapon. Arrest Warrant is still active

20231825148 – Assault Police Officer – On December 12th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members arrested a 19 year old male for breaching court ordered conditions. During the arrest, the male assaulted one of the officers and was subsequently charged with Assaulting a Police Officer. The male was held and brought before the court.

20231822144 – Assault with a Weapon – On December 12th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members arrested a 29 year old male for Assault with a Weapon. The male was later released and will appear in court at a later date.

20231843380 – Sexual Assault – On December 16th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an assault. Upon attending members arrested a 23 year old male for Sexual Assault. The male is scheduled to appear in court at a later date.
