Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2023/2024 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Members will also be looking to conduct ATV Patrols during the summer and Skidoo Patrols during the Winter.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

20253855 – Break and Enter – On Jan 1st 2025 HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a residential Break and Enter. Members attended the area and were advised that the Male suspect fled the area. Police Dog Services attended and were to track/locate the 29 year old male suspect who was taken into custody. The male was charged with numerous offences including Break and Enter, Possession of Stolen Property, Weapons Possession, Breach of Court Order, and Resist Arrest. The male was brought before the court and remanded into custody

202517698 – Assault – On Jan 4th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members arrested a 26 year old male for Assault(Strangulation) and Mischief – Damage to Property. The male was held and brought before the court

202521264 – Assault Police Officer – On Jan 5th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance. Upon attending members were advised that a 35 year old female was intoxicated and disturbing persons in the area. Members arrested the female who was uncooperative with members and resisted arrested, During the altercation she also struck one of the officers. The female was arrested and charged with resisting arrest and Assaulting a Police Officer.

202546008 – Assault Police Officer With a Weapon – On Jan 11th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a female being chased by a male. Members attended and were advised that a male had attempted to strike a female with his vehicle. Members were able to locate the male suspect in his vehicle and when attempting to conduct a traffic stop the male refused to stop, almost striking the officers vehicle. Members were able to contain the vehicle, but the suspect attempted to flee, almost striking the officers, but became struck. Members were able to gain access to the vehicle and remove the male. The 58 year old male was arrested and charged with Assault Causing Bodily Harm, Assault with a Weapon(X2), Resist Arrest, Flight from Police Officer, Assaulting a Police Officer with a Weapon, and multiple offences under the Highway Traffic Act. The male was brought before the court where he was later released on conditions to appear in court at a later date.

202570690 – Disarming a Police Officer – On Jan 16th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an assault. Upon attending members arrested a 35 year old female and during the interaction the female assaulted one of the officers and attempted to Disarm the officer. The female has been charged with Disarming a Police Officer and Assaulting a Police Officer.

2025119678 – Assault – On Jan 27th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at the Hospital. Members attended and learned that a female had assaulted a male and fled in a vehicle. The 23 year old female was later located and arrested in relation to the assault and is set to appear in court at a later date
