Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2023/2024 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Detachment Members partnered with Traffic Services and conducted several Skidoo patrols in the area conducting enforcement and offering education on applicable legislation.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

2025165230 – Break and Enter – On Feb 6th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter at a local business. Members attended and learned that entry had been gained at the Business and approx. \$14,000 worth of merchandise was stolen. A media release was completed and the investigation is ongoing.

2025205009 – Assault Police Officer – On Feb 15th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Disturbance involving an intoxicated female at a business. Members attended and arrested a 21 year old female. During the interaction the female resisted arrested and assault both Police Officers. The female was later released to appear in court at a later date facing charges of Assaulting a Police Officer and Resist Arrest

2025204917 – Fail to Comply/Resist – On Feb 15th HVGB RCMP members were on patrol when they came upon a 32 year old male in breach of his court order. The male was subsequently arrested for failing to comply with court order. The male resisted arrest and upon being transported to RCMP Cells, the male damaged property. The male was held for court and is facing charges of Fail to Comply, resist arrest, and Mischief – Damage to Property

2025209174 – Breach of Court Order – On February 15th HVGB RCMP were conducting compliance checks on persons bound by court orders to abide by Curfew. Member noted a 31 year old female who was in breach of her curfew. The female was later located and arrested for breaching her conditions and brought before the court. The female was later released by the court to re-appear on a later date

2025205009 – Break and Enter – On Feb 18th HVGB RCMP responded to an Alarm at a local business. Upon attending members noted that the business had been broken into. While examining the area members noted that another business in the area had also been broken into. Police Dog Services was contacted and attended the scene. A 36 year old male was located hiding in the area and was arrested for Break and Enter(X2) and failing to comply with a court order. The male was held for court where he was released to abide by a set of conditions and return to court at a later date.

2025235133 – Robbery – On February 21st HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Robbery at a local business where two unknown persons had entered the business demanding money while one of the suspects was armed with a firearm. Suspect were able to flee the scene with a quantity of cash. HVGB RCMP along with Police Dog Services and extensive patrols were made but the suspects were not located. Labrador District GIS have assumed the lead and the investigation is ongoing.
