Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2025/2026 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan is currently under development. The APP assigns priorities and goals which help us focus on concerns raised by Detachment Management, Divisional Priorities, and concerns raised by local Stakeholders. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year. The previous years assigned priorities are noted below.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

2025421961 – Impaired Operation – On April 1st HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a possible impaired driver. Members were able to locate and conduct a traffic stop with the suspect vehicle on Kelland Drive. A 37 year old male was arrested for Impaired Operation. The male is facing charges of Impaired Driving and Driving over 80mg. The vehicle was impounded and the driver was issued a driving suspension.

2025427518 – Assault With a Weapon – On April 2nd HVGB RCMP received a report of ongoing violence at a residential property. During the course of the investigation a 51 Year old woman and a 27 year old male were arrested. The Female is facing charges of Uttering Threats

and Breach of Conditions. The male is facing charges of Assault with a Weapon(x2), Forcible Confinement, Mischief, Assault, and Breach of a Court Order.

2025435319 – Break and Enter – On April 4th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter at a residential property. Members attended and the 30 year old male suspect was arrested on scene. The male has been charged for Break and Enter and Breach of a Court order. He was held in custody and brought before the court

2025439317 – Being Unlawfully at Large – On April 4th HVGB RCMP were advised that a male serving an Intermittent Sentence had failed to attend. Members were able to locate the 40 year old male and he was charged with Being Unlawfully at Large and held to appear in court. The male was convicted of the offence and received additional time to his previously imposed sentence.

2025486272 – Assault on Police – On April 14th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance involving an intoxicated male and female. Members attended and arrested the male. During the arrest the 27 year old male assaulted the responding members. The male is facing three counts of Assaulting a Police Officer and resist arrest.

2025512741 – Break and Enter – On April 18th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter at a residential property. Members attended and a 29 year old male was located and arrested on scene. During the interaction with Police the male attempted to flee. The male was taken into custody and is facing charges of Mischief(Damage to Property), Resist Arrest, Break and Enter, along with multiple breaches of a court order.

2025516132 – Assault Police Officer – On April 19th HVGB RCMP responded to a report that a female was smashing the windows of the vehicle. Members attended and located the 27 year old female and placed her under arrest. The female assaulted the officer during the interaction and was charged with Assault Police Officer, Resist Arrest, Mischief, and Breach of a Court Order.

2025525278 – Break and Enter – On April 21st HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a break and enter at a residential property. Upon investigation, grounds existed to arrest and charge a 33 year old male for Break and Enter, along with multiple breaches of a Court Order. The male has been evading police, thus an Arrest Warrant has been sought and approved. Efforts continue to locate and arrest the suspect

2025526362 – Break and Enter – On April 21st HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter where it was noted the suspect was still present. Members responded and upon attending located and arrested a 43 year old male for Break and Enter. Charges have been laid and the male will appear in court at a later date

2025553940 – Pointing a Firearm – On April 26th HVGB RCMP received a report of a suspicious male believed to be in possession of a firearm. Members attended the scene and were noted that a male had pointed a firearm at several people. The 35 year old male was located still on the property and was taken into custody. The male was charged with Pointing a Firearm(X2),

Careless Use of a Firearm, and Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose. The male was held in custody and brought before the court.

Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP wishes to thank our citizens for all of their assistance in combating crime and making our Community a safe one.
