Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2025/2026 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan is currently under development. The APP assigns priorities and goals which help us focus on concerns raised by Detachment Management, Divisional Priorities, and concerns raised by local Stakeholders. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year. The previous years assigned priorities are noted below.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

2025641582 – Assault Police Officer – On May 12th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an intoxicated male refusing to leave a business. Members attended and arrested a 2 year old male. During the arrest the male resisted officers and assaulted an officer. The male who was bound by a court order to abide by multiple conditions has been charged with Resist Arrest, Assaulting a Police Officer, and several breaches of his court order.

2025661571 – Uttering Threats – On May 16th HVGB RCMP responded to a report that a male was threatening staff at a local business. Members attended and arrested a 42 year old male for uttering threats. During the interaction with Police, the male also threatened the police officer

and damaged the Police Vehicle. The male is facing several charges of Uttering Threats and a charge of Mischief – Damage to Property

2025669248 – Assault with a Weapon – On May 17th HVGB RCMP responded to a report that a male had been assaulted by two people, one of which was in possession of a knife. Members attended and learned that an adult Male and a Female Youth assaulted another male and a female. It was reported that the female youth was in possession of a knife during the altercation. The adult male was arrested and is facing charges of Assault. The female youth was also arrested and is facing charges of Assault, Assault with a Weapon, Uttering Threats(X2), and possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose

2025681649 – Assault with a Weapon – On May 19th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance involving multiple persons. Members attended and learned that a male had been assaulted by three females. Three females aged 31 years old, 32 years old, and 55 years old were arrested and all three are facing charges of Assault with a Weapon. The 31 and 32 year old females are facing additional charges of Breaching a Court Order

2025691865 – Possession of a Weapon – On May 21st HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance. Members attended and learned that male had been walking through the area brandishing a knife. Members attended and arrested a 34 year old male. The male has been charged with Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose

2025697082 – Forcible Confinement – On May 22nd HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Domestic Dispute. Members attended and were advised that a female had been assaulted and her boyfriend wouldn't let her leave the residence. Members were able to locate and arrest a 34 year old male. The male is facing charges of Assault, Forcible Confinement, Uttering Threats, and Mischief – Damage to Property

2025702544 – Break and Enter – On May 23rd HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter. Members attended and learned that a male had broke into a residence and assaulted the occupant. Members arrested a 22 year old male who is facing charges of Break and Enter and Assault with a Weapon(x2). Parties are known to each other.

2025705120 – Assault with a Weapon – On May 23rd HVGB RCMP responded to a report that a female had been assaulted by her boyfriend. Members attended and the male suspect attempted to flee from police. The 27 year old male was arrested and is facing charges of Assault with a weapon, Resist Arrest, Breach of probation, and several Breaches of a court order

2025727317 – Assault with a Weapon – On May 27th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance. Upon attending members located a male who required medical treatment and was transported to the hospital. Upon investigation it was learned that the injured male had been assaulted by two females and a male. A 31 Year old female was arrested and charged with Assault with a Weapon(X2) and Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose. Another 31 year old female was charged with a single count of Assault with a Weapon and Possession of a

Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose. A 37 Year old male was also charged with Assault with a weapon, Assault, and Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose

Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP wishes to thank our citizens for all of their assistance in combating crime and making our Community a safe one.
