### **Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities**

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2026/2027 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan is currently under development. The APP assigns priorities and goals which help us focus on concerns raised by Detachment Management, Divisional Priorities, and concerns raised by local Stakeholders. The

progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year. The previous years assigned priorities are noted below.

**(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement**

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences.

**(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property**

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

**(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

**\*\*\*\*The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.\*\*\*\***

**Notable Investigations:**

2026433319 – Break and Enter – On April 4<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter into a shared facility area. Members attended and located two persons inside. A 54 Year old male and a 41 year old female were arrested and charged with Break and Enter. Both are set to appear at a later date related to the charges

2026433420 – Assault – On April 4<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Members attended and learned there had been an assault and the suspect fled prior to police arrival. Members were able to locate the accused, 39 year old male, who was charged with

Assault, Assault While Choking, Forcible Confinement, Breach of Probation, and Breach of a Court order. The accused was brought before court where he was released on conditions to appear at a later date

2026442845 – Forcible Confinement – On April 6<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending it was learned that there had been an assault and the suspect fled the residence. Members later located and arrested a 30 year old male for Assault, Forcible Confinement, and Mischief. He was brought before the court and released to appear at a later date

2026468147 – Assault Causing Bodily Harm – On April 11<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP received a report of an assault. Member attended and located a male victim who required medical treatment. A 25 year old male was arrested and charged with Assault Causing Bodily Harm and is set to appear in court at a later date

2026506342 – Break and Enter – On April 18<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP received a report of a possible Break and Enter. Member attended and learned apartment was entered and several items were stolen. During investigation members were able to ID and arrest a 32 Year old Female who is facing charges of Break and Enter and Mischief(Damage to Property). The accused is set to appear in court at a later date

2026508655 – Break and Enter – On April 19<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a possible Break and Enter. Members attended and located a 37 year old female on scene. The female was arrested and charged with Break and Enter and will appear in court at a later date

2026545518 – Possession of a Weapon – On April 26<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP received a report of a disturbance at a local business. Upon attending members noted consider damage had been caused. Several persons were arrested on scene and upon further investigation two person have been charged related to the matter.

A 23 year old female is facing charges of Mischief(Damage to Property Over\$5000), Possession of a Weapon for a dangerous purpose, Mischief Under \$5000, Uttering Threats, and Breaching a Court Order. She has been remanded into custody to await a further appearance

A 30 year old male is facing charges of Break and Enter and Mischief Under \$5000. He was brought before the court and released on conditions to appear at a later date

2026561562 – Aggravated Assault – On April 29<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP received a report of an injured male in the roadway. Members attended and learned the male had been assaulted and required medical treatment. Upon investigation, two males aged 21 and 36, were both arrested and charged with Aggravated Assault and Assault with a Weapon. Both males were brought before court. The 21 year old male was remanded into custody and the 36 year old male was released on conditions to appear at a later date
