### **Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities**

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2026/2027 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan is currently under development. The APP assigns priorities and goals which help us focus on concerns raised by Detachment Management, Divisional Priorities, and concerns raised by local Stakeholders. The

progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year. The previous years assigned priorities are noted below.

**(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement**

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences.

**(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property**

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

**(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

**Notable Investigations:**

2026572182 – Aggravated Assault – On May 1st HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an assault at a residence. Members attended and learned that a 28 year old male had broken into a residence and assaulted a female. And a 23 year old female had assaulted another male with a weapon. Members located an injured male that required medical attention. The 23 year old female was arrested and charged with Aggravated Assault, Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose, and Assaulting a Police Officer. A 28 year old male was arrested and charged with Break and Enter, Assault, and Breach of a Court Order. The female was brought before the court and released to appear at a later date. The male was remanded into custody

2026604909 – Assault on a Police Officer – On May 7<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an intoxicated male causing a disturbance. Members attended and attempted to arrest the male. The male assaulted one of the officers and attempted to choke the officer. Members were able to restrain the male who was subsequently arrested and charged with Assaulting a Police Officer and Resisting Arrest. The 48 year old male was brought before the court and remanded into custody

2026622604 – Assault on a Police Officer – On May 10<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a request for assistance with an intoxicated female. Members attended and the female assaulted the responding officer. The female was arrested and charged with Assaulting a Police Officer and Resisting Arrest. She will appear in court at a later date.

2026624643 – Break and Enter – On May 10<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an Alarm at a local Business. Upon attending it was learned the Business had been broken into. Upon investigation members were able to ID the involved suspects and both males were located and arrested. A 39 year old male and a 33 year old male were charged with Break and Enter, Mischief, Theft, and Fail to Comply of a Court Order. Both males were brought before the court and released to re-appear on a later date

2026681060 – Single Motor Vehicle Collision – On May 21<sup>st</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a single vehicle motor vehicle collision. Upon attending the scene with HVGB Fire Department, the lone occupant had suffered serious injuries and was transported to the Hospital. The circumstances surrounding the cause of the collision remain under investigation.

2026736205 – Possession of Cocaine – On May 30<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance and arrested a Female. Upon conducting a search, a quantity of Cocaine was located and the 27 year old female was arrested and charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance. She will appear in court at a later date

2026733250 – Uttering Threats – On May 30<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at the Hospital. It was reported that a male had assaulted two other persons. Members attended and arrested a 25 year old male two counts of assault. During his interaction with police the arrested male made numerous threats towards the officers, their families, and property. The male has been charged with Two counts of assault, seven counts of Uttering Threats, Resist Arrest, and Fail to Comply with an Undertaking. The male was held and brought before the court. He was later released to re-appear at a later date

2026739335 – Assault Causing Bodily Harm – On May 31<sup>st</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a business. Members attended and located an injured female who advised she had been assaulted by a male who fled the area. Members were able to locate the male a short distance away. The 24 year old male was arrested and charged with Assault Causing Bodily Harm.

Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP wishes to thank our citizens for all of their assistance in combating crime and making our Community a safe one.
