Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2025/2026 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan is currently under development. The APP assigns priorities and goals which help us focus on concerns raised by Detachment Management, Divisional Priorities, and concerns raised by local Stakeholders. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year. The previous years assigned priorities are noted below.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

20261213 – Assault with a Weapon – On January 1st, 2026 HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending it was learned that two males had broken into the residence and assaulted a resident. Members arrested two males aged, 24 and 28. The 28 year old male was charged with Break and Enter, Assault with a Weapon, Fail to Comply with Court Conditions(X3), Mischief, and Uttering Threats. The 24 year old male was charged with Break and Enter, Mischief, Uttering Threats, Breach of Probation, and Assault with a Weapon. Both males were held in custody and brought before the Court. Both males have been remain in custody awaiting further court appearances.

20261991 – Break and Enter – On January 1st, 2026 HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Members arrested a 39 year old male for Break and Enter. The male was later released and will appear in court at a later date for charges of Break and Enter.

202611456 – Sexual Assault – On January 3rd, 2026 HVGB RCMP responded to a report of Sexual Assault. Upon investigation, a 43 year old male was arrested for Sexual Assault. The male was already in custody related to a separate matter. The male remains in custody and will appear in court at a later date

202629685 – Sexual Assault – On January 7th, 2026 HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a domestic assault. Members attended and learned incident occurred several days prior. After investigation, a 31 year old male was arrested and charged with Sexual Assault, Assault, Forcible confinement, and Uttering Threats. The male was held for court and later released to re-appear at a later date

202637238 – Break and Enter – On Jan 9th, 2026 HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Break and Enter. Upon investigation a 33 year old female was arrested and charged with Break and Enter and will appear in court at a later date

202654392 – Assault with a Weapon – On January 13th, 2026 HVGB RCMP received a report that there was a Facebook Live stream posted showing a female being assaulted at a residence. Members were able to locate the scene and attended. Members arrested a 38 year old male who has been charged with Assault with a Weapon, Assault, and Assault while Choking

On January 30th HVGB RCMP, along with resource enforcement conducted Snowmobile patrols around HVGB. Members conducted checks to ensure persons had Trail Passes and were wearing Helmets. Members of the Grand River Lake Snowmobile Club and the Trail Groomer were also present.

Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP wishes to thank our citizens for all of their assistance in combating crime and making our Community a safe one.
