The 24th meeting of the 13th Elected Town Council of the Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay was – held on Tuesday, October 25, 2022, at 5:00 PM and called to order by Mayor George Andrews.

1. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA OF THE 24th MEETING

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Wallace and seconded by Councillor Bennett to adopt the agenda of the 24th meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay. All in favour. Motion carried unanimously.

2. DELEGATIONS

a. Jaclyn Penney- Ms. Penney spoke to Council regarding some of the issues they are facing at CONA Daycare with respect to the Transient issue. Ms. Penney works at the daycare centre, and she said they are not able to take the children out on walks because of incidents that have happened just feet away from the play area. She said it is very sad that children cannot play without being subject to inappropriate behaviour by these people. Ms. Penney said the parking area is right next to the airplane where these people hang out and the employees are harassed on a daily basis for money, cigarettes, etc. She said something needs to change now and she hopes hearing how this is affecting our children in daycare will help with trying to solve the situation.

b. Perry Trimper-Mr. Trimper addressed Council following up from Ms. Penney's words. He said if only we knew of an immediate solution, but it's elusive. He said he spoke to a gentleman at an event recently that is battling addictions and he shared some of his challenges. He said he knows the pressure placed on business's, children and families and concerns with public safety. Mr. Trimper said he is committed to being available to everyone to seek solutions. He said he is looking at other jurisdictions to see how they are doing.

Mr. Trimper noted the province is in a better fiscal position and he looks forward to supporting the Town in their infrastructure requests. He said the province currently has more than twenty pieces of legislation that will have a positive effect on Municipalities. He said Route 520 will see further upgrades next year and he is working with the Minister on that.

Mr. Trimper said there is a good relationship between 5 Wing and the Town, and he is looking forward to a bright future.

Mr. Trimper said health care continues to dominate many issues and Municipalities are going to see the disappearance of LGH and a Single Care entity be put in place that he hopes will be seamless. He encouraged Council to reach out with any health care matters.
