1. ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA OF THE 42nd MEETING

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Wallace and seconded by Councillor Rumbolt to adopt the agenda of the 42nd meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay. All in favour. Motion carried unanimously.

2. **DELEGATIONS**

a. Hollis Yetman & Tony Chubbs-Labrador Hunting & Fishing Association-The LHFA spoke to Council regarding an application for exemption of taxes at their presentation to the FAP committee in June and that they have not received a response from the Town. Councillor Rumbolt said Council has to view this as a budget item as it affects revenue. She said Council is working on creating a policy for Not for Profits that is in the best interest of all NFP groups. Council is working to create a policy that involves less paperwork and they feel the current policy is not efficient. The LHFA said they, as well as most NFP's are made up mostly of volunteers and things such as the Amaruk, Birch Brook and the Boardwalk would not exist otherwise. He referred to the LHFA Shooting Range

and said the Range services many organizations, such as the RCMP, Department of Wildlife, etc. however it does not generate much revenue and they cannot increase fees to cover taxes. He said they have operated for 12 years without a tax bill and were only issued a tax bill after they got a permit to put in two outhouses at the Range. Mayor Andrews said each NFP group is unique and Council is trying to come up with a policy that works for everyone and in line with Council and legislative perspective. He said it is a topic for budget consideration and they are hoping to simplify the policy so that it is similar to the low income relief application.

6. COMMUNITY SERVICES & RECREATION- Deputy Mayor Ella Wallace

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Wallace and seconded by Councillor Rumbolt to accept the Community Services and Recreation Report for August. Councillor Compton Hobbs voted against the report. All others voted in favour. Motion carried.

Councillor Compton Hobbs said she is not in favour of moving the Senior's Fun Day from Kinsmen Park as she feels it limits the accessibility of residents at the Long-Term Care to attend. She said the dance floor was put in place for functions such as this and feels the event should stay like it has in the past.

Councillor Compton Hobbs had questions about the McLean Street playground, so Councillor Winters declared conflict and left Council table at 6:16 PM.

Councillor Compton Hobbs asked if the committee had funds left for signage for the playground. Deputy Mayor Wallace advised that DFO will have costs finalized this week, however the project is no cost to the Town and the signage will be the responsibility of the playground committee. Councillor Compton Hobbs also asked if fencing should be placed around the playground considering its proximity to the road. Councillor Pomeroy advised that full fencing is not recommended, but other barriers can be used such as the piping at Steve's Playground. Councillor Winters returned to Council table at 6:22 PM.
