The Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP Detachment responded to a total of 571 occurrences, which were classified as calls for service during August 2022, compared to 640 occurrences in 2021.

A total of 172 persons were incarcerated for a variety of Offences during the month of August.

Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2022/2023 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Members will also be looking to conduct ATV Patrols during the summer and Skidoo Patrols during the Winter. On Aug 2nd and Aug 25th HVGB Detachment Members conducted ATV Patrols throughout the Trails around HVGB. While no infractions were noted, members took the opportunity to interact with local residents on the Trails. Members also conducted Checkstops utilizing Mandatory Alcohol Screening. HVGB RCMP issued a roadside suspension to a male while seized his DL and impounding his vehicle

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks will be conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance. HVGB Detachment Members arrested a 42 year old male for Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking, which involved a seizure of a controlled substance that has a street value of approx \$4000. Charges have been laid against the male.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Detachment Commander will also ensure regular contact is maintained and meetings planned with partner agencies to seek opportunities to work together and help resolve any arising issues. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools and contact with resume once School Re-opens in the Fall.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

20221090299 – Assault with a Weapon – On Aug 4th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending it was learned that a 29 year old male had assaulted several persons. The male suspect was located and arrested. He is facing charges of Assault with a Weapon and Assault

20221137933 – Assault with a Weapon – On Aug 12th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an ongoing assault. Upon attending it was learned that a 43 year old female had assaulted a male with a weapon. The female suspect was arrested and charged with Assault with a Weapon

20221138019 – Sexual Interference – On Aug 12th HVGB RCMP received information that an Adult Male was involved in a sexual relationship with a female youth. As a result of the investigation a 31 year old male was arrested for Sexual Interference, Sexual Assault, and Disobeying a Court Order.

20221178829 – Assault with a Weapon – On Aug 19th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a male driving a vehicle in a dangerous manner. Members attended and it was reported that the Complainants vehicle was intentionally struck by the suspects vehicle and the suspect threatened the victim. A 43 year old male was arrested and charged with Assault with a Weapon, Uttering Threats, Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle, Failing to comply with Court Order, Operating Vehicle without a Drivers Licence. During the arrest a quantity of cocaine was seized and the suspect was also charged with Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking

20221185040 – Assault Causing Bodily Harm – On Aug 20th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of Domestic Violence. Upon investigation a 27 year old male was arrested and charged with Assault Causing Bodily Harm and Assault.

20221182168 – Roadside Suspension – On Aug 20th HVGB RCMP conducted a vehicle stop. An Impaired Driving investigation was initiated and roadside testing was completed. As a result of the examination the 33 year old male was issued with a roadside suspension, his drivers licence was seized and the vehicle was impounded.

20221191191 – Aggravated Assault – On August 21st HVGB RCMP responded to a report that a male had been assaulted and was suffering from severe head injuries. Members attended and the male victim was transported to the hospital for Medical Treatment. Upon investigation a 19 year old male was arrested and charged with Aggravated Assault.

20221227904 – Unlawfully in a Dwelling – On Aug 27th HVGB responded to a report that a female was located inside a residence in which she was bound by Court Order to remain away from. Members attended and a 30 year old female was arrested and charged with Being Unlawfully in a Dwelling, Resist/Obstruct a Peace Officer, and breaches of a Court Order
