Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2023/2024 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Members will also be looking to conduct ATV Patrols during the summer and Skidoo Patrols during the Winter.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

2023778265 – Impaired Driving – On June 3rd HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a possible impaired driver. Members attended the area and located the suspect vehicle. The 62 year old female driver failed the roadside screening and later provided breath samples which were almost twice the legal limit. The vehicle was impounded and the Driver is facing charges of Impaired Operation and Driving over 80mg, along with being issued a driving suspension.

2023787812 – Possession of a Weapon – On June 5th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a suspicious male in possession of a weapon at a local business. Members attended and arrested an 18 year old male who was found in possession of several weapons and who also had an outstanding warrant. The male was arrested and brought before the courts. He is facing charges of possession of a weapon for a Dangerous purpose(x3)

2023789272 – Assault PO – On June 5th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members arrested a 23 year old female for Mischief under \$5000 and Breach of a Court Order. During this interaction the female was uncooperative and assaulted one of the responding members. The female is also facing charges of Assaulting a Police Officer and Resist Arrest. Matter is before the courts.

2023821523 – Sexual Assault – On June 11th HVGB RCMP responded to an ongoing disturbance at a local business. Members attended and upon investigation, arrested a 27 year old male for Sexual Assault, Assault, Forcible Confinement, and Theft Under. The male was brought before the courts

2023841408 – Assault PO – On June 15th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an ongoing assault and disturbance at a local business. Upon attending members arrested a 26 year old female for Assault and Uttering Threats. During interaction with the members, the female assaulted one of the members and was subsequently arrested for Assaulting a Police. Matter is before the courts

2023847796 – Aggravated Assault – On June 16th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members learned that a male had been stabbed. Members immediately began providing first aid to injured male. The suspect, a 22 year old female, was arrested at the scene and is facing charges of Aggravated Assault. The Labrador District GIS Unit has been assisting with the investigation.

2023864504 – Assault with a Weapon – On June 19th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a female who attended a neighbours residence seeking assistance. Members attended arrested a 27 year old male for Assault with a Weapon and Assault(Choking). The victim sought medical treatment. Matter is before the courts

2023897692 – Impaired Operation - On June 24th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a possible impaired driver. Members attended the area and located the suspect vehicle. The 55 year old male driver failed the roadside screening and later provided breath samples which were almost twice the legal limit. The vehicle was impounded and the Driver is facing charges of Impaired Operation and Driving over 80mg, Offences under the Highway Traffic Act, along with being issued a driving suspension.
