Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2023/2024 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan has been set with final updates on assigned priorities and goals which help us focus on the above noted areas. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences. Members will also be looking to conduct ATV Patrols during the summer and Skidoo Patrols during the Winter.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

20231467365 – Assault with a Weapon – On October 2nd, HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an assault. Upon attending members learned that a 44 year old male had assaulted a female. The male was arrested for Assault, Assault with a Weapon, and Assault While Choking. The male was brought before the courts where he was released to re-appear at a later date

20231478752 – Assault Police Officer – On October 4th HVGB RCMP responded to a disturbance. As members attempted to arrest a 22 year old male, he attempted to flee and resist officers. During the altercation the male assaulted both officers. The male was arrested and has been charged with Resist Arrest, Assault PO, and Breach of Probation. The male was brought before the court where he was released and will re-appear in court at a later date.

20231482697 – Possession of a Weapon – On October 5th HVGB RCMP noted a male following a female for whom he was on conditions to have no contact with. The 37 year old male was arrested for breaching a court order and possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose. While in Police Custody the male also caused damage to RCMP Property and was subsequently charged with Mischief. The male was brought before the court where he was released to re-appear in court at a later date.

20231495185 – Assault with a Weapon – On October 7th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Upon attending members arrested a 36 year old male for Assault with a Weapon, Assault Causing Bodily Harm, Resist Arrest, Forcible Confinement, and Assault PO(X2). The male was brought before the court where he was released to re-appear at a later date

20231530325 – Assault with a Weapon – On October 14th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an altercation at a residence. Upon attending one male was transported to the hospital for medical treatment for his injuries. The suspect fled the residence but later returned and attempted to hide from Police. A 32 year old male was arrested and charged with Assault with a Weapon and Resist Arrest. The male was brought before the courts and released to re-appear at a later date

20231544193 – Being Unlawfully in a Dwelling – On October 17th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of two unwanted persons in a residence. Members attended and learned that two males had forced their way into a residence. Members arrested a 30 year old male for Being Unlawfully in a Dwelling and Mischief. He was later released to appear in court at a later date. A 36 year old male was also arrested for Being Unlawfully in a Dwelling, Mischief, Uttering Threats, and Fail to Comply with a Court Order(X2). He was brought before the court and remanded into custody

20231615997 – Arson – On October 31st HVGB RCMP responded to a fire at a local Business. Members attended, along with HVGB Fire Department. The scene was held and a Fire Investigator attended. The matter remains under investigation
