#### ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA OF THE 15<sup>th</sup> MEETING 1.

It was moved by Councillor Dyson-Edmunds and seconded by Councillor Crann to adopt the agenda of the 15th meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Happy Valley-Goose Bay. Motion carried.

#### 2. DELEGATIONS

a. Wayne LeGrow addressed Council about the ongoing problem of sand around Town; specifically, on lawns and more particularly on his lawn. He said it is very difficult and labour intensive to get rid of. He said the town operators do a great job of Snowclearing but the snowblower and grader just deposits the sand farther in on the property. He said he spends more than \$1,000 each year to keep his lawn looking nice, but with all the sand it seems it's just money gone to waste. He said now he will need to spend more money to have the sand removed. He said he has even tried the tarpaulin method, but that too is expensive and labour intensive. He asked what the Town plans

to do to alleviate the problem. He questioned whether the Town will be investing in vacuum equipment or possibly sweeping everyone's lawn.

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## 11. COUNCILLORS FORUM

Councillor Baikie advised that she has been away and had no updates for Councillor's Forum.

Councillor Compton Hobbs welcomed Town Manager Robert Andrews and said she is looking forward to working with him. She said she is looking forward to the additional Community Constable; Mr. Gary Bolger coming on staff in June as well and that it will be a good addition to staff. She reminded everyone that there are lots of upcoming events and encouraged everyone to get out and participate.

Councillor Dyson-Edmunds welcomed Robert Andrews as well. She advised that Naomi Sharpe has left the organization and wished her all the best in her new posting. She advised that Naomi did a wonderful job and she will be missed. Councillor Dyson-Edmunds said the Junior Lab Cup went very well this past weekend and she is looking forward to the Senior Lab Cup coming up next weekend. She advised she has been talking to many people at the arena and said the turf floor is being very well received.

Youth Councillor Wells welcomed Robert Andrews as well. She acknowledged the MMC Student Council and the work they have done over the past year. She encouraged students to become involved in Student Government as it is a tremendous experience. She welcomed Sophia Graham from MMC student government to Council Chambers.

Councillor Crann also welcomed Robert Andrews and said if you're up for a challenge; you're in the right place. Councillor Crann said he may be away for the June meeting so he wished Youth Councillor Wells all the best in her future endeavours and thanked her for her time on Council. Councillor Crann said his fellow Masons are very pleased with their contribution to the Turf Floor at the arena, it is money well spent. Councillor Crann said he helped out with the Salvation Army dinner for the homeless on Saturday and encouraged others to help out as well He said the dinner happens the first Saturday of each month at 12 and it is a very rewarding experience. Councillor Crann spoke of the amount of garbage around Town and issued a challenge for people to Adopt a Spot and clean up that area. He advised that he has adopted Aspen Road and will be cleaning up the entire street.

Deputy Mayor Pomeroy welcomed Robert Andrews and thanked Randy Dillon and Paul Motty for filling in over the last few months. He thanked Naomi Sharpe for her dedication and great work and wished her well. Deputy Mayor Pomeroy said there is definitely a lot of talk about sand and landscaping and even though we don't have regulations; we do have policies and are trying to follow them. He agreed that Council should lead by example and having regulations would encourage landscaping and cut down on sand.

Mayor Andersen welcomed Robert Andrews and said his experience will bring a lot to the table. He said Managers and Council will work with him and even though they may not always agree on everything, they will all work together for the betterment of the Town. Mayor Andersen said he is expecting a letter today or tomorrow with respect to the water form Spring Gulch. Once received it will be reviewed by the Lawyer and then he will let people know when they will be getting better water in the Valley. Mayor Andersen referred to the issue of Data Centres and said he raised this concern to Government and have also asked that the Engineer and Town 7

Manager research ways to proceed. He said most people agree that we need power for the Town to grow and offer good jobs for it's people. Mayor Andersen spoke of the sand issue and said he is surprised that nothing has been done before and that this Council is sending a clear message that they are making a commitment to get sand off people's lawns. Mayor Andersen said he attended the CCL meeting in St. John's last week and there was good discussion with Ministers. He said he spoke with Minister Trimper about several issues; including the fact that there are several patients waiting to be transferred to hospital in St. john's. Mayor Andersen wished Naomi well in her next posting and said staff is in the process of filling the position. He acknowledged youth Councillor Wells and thanked her for representing the students of MMC. He said there are only two municipalities in the province that have youth Councillors, but he expects more will follow suit in September. Mayor Andersen said Council is making good headway and will continue to work to resolve issues. He thanked staff for their work and the gallery for taking time to attend the meeting.

There being no further business, a Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Councillor Compton Hobbs and seconded by Councillor Crann. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:01PM.
