The Happy Valley-Goose Bay RCMP Detachment responded to a total of 675 occurrences, which were classified as calls for service during October 2025, compared to 734 occurrences in 2024.

A total of 183 persons were incarcerated for a variety of Offences during the month of October

### **Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities**

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2025/2026 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan is currently under development. The APP assigns priorities and goals which help us focus on concerns raised by Detachment Management, Divisional Priorities, and concerns raised by local Stakeholders. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year. The previous years assigned priorities are noted below.

**(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement**

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences.

**(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property**

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

**(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

**\*\*\*\*The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.\*\*\*\***

**Notable Investigations:**

20251472391 – Aggravated Assault – On October 3<sup>rd</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a serious assault in Gull Island. Members attended and a female victim was provided with medical treatment and transport to the local hospital. A 28 year old male was arrested and charged with Aggravated Assault, Possession of a Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose, Forcible Confinement, and Uttering Threats.

20251544685 – Refusal – On October 17<sup>th</sup> HVGB responded to a report of a possible impaired driver. Members attended and were able to locate the suspect vehicle. Members arrested a 37 year old male for impaired operation. The male refused to comply with a demand to provide

breath samples and has been charged with Refusal. The male was also charged with Operating a Motor Vehicle with a suspended licence. The vehicle was towed and impounded.

20251557363 – Arson – On October 19<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Fire at a local business. Upon attending it was learned that a female and intentional set fire to material on the property. A 29 Year old female was arrested and has been charged with Arson.

20251554791 - Impaired Operation - On October 19<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP conducted a traffic stop that resulted in a 33 year old male being arrested for Impaired Operation of a Motor Vehicle. The male provided breath samples almost twice the legal limit. The male has been charged with Impaired Operation, Driving over 80 mg, and several breaches of a court order.

20251556904 – Impaired Operation/Refusal – On October 19<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a motor vehicle collision involving an off road vehicles with injuries. Driver of one of the vehicles was found to be impaired. The 53 year old male failed to comply with a Demand and has been charged with Refusal to Comply with a Demand.

20251560503 – Assault with a Weapon - On October 20<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a residence. Members attended and learned hat a 28 year old female assaulted another female while in possession of a weapon, Charges of Assault with a Weapon have nee filed with the court and an Arrest Warrant has been issued for the suspect who is evading police.

20251579068 – Assault with a Weapon – On October 23<sup>rd</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a disturbance at a business. Upon attending it was learned that a female had attempted to assault staff with a weapon. A 52 year old female was arrested and is facing charges of Assault with a Weapon.

20251611928 – Possession Cocaine – On October 30<sup>th</sup> HVGB RCMP conducted a traffic stop on Hamilton River Road. The three occupants were arrested for Drug Possession. A Quantity of Cocaine, Drug Paraphernalia and Cash was seized as part of the investigation. A 42 year old male was charged with Possession of Cocaine, Fail to Comply with a Court Order, and Operating a Motor Vehicle with a Suspended licence

20251618745 – Possession for Purpose of Trafficking – On October 31<sup>st</sup> HVGB RCMP, along with Police Dog Services, conducted a traffic stop and arrested the four vehicle occupants for possession of a controlled substance. The 37 year old female driver was arrested and held for court due to an outstanding arrest warrant. Two other male occupants were arrested but upon investigation were released. A 36 year old female was arrested and is facing charges of Possession of Cocaine for the Purpose of Trafficking. A quantity of cocaine and drug paraphernalia was seized during the investigation.

20251616893 – Impaired Operation – On October 31<sup>st</sup> HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a possible impaired driver. Members were able to locate the suspect vehicle and arrested a 26 year old male for impaired operation. The male provided breath samples over the legal limit and is facing charges of Impaired Operation and Driving over 80mg.
