Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

- (1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement;**
- (2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property;**
- (3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community**

The 2025/2026 Happy Valley Goose Bay RCMP Annual Performance Plan is currently under development. The APP assigns priorities and goals which help us focus on concerns raised by Detachment Management, Divisional Priorities, and concerns raised by local Stakeholders. The progress of this plan will be monitored throughout the year. The previous years assigned priorities are noted below.

(1) Enhance Road Safety – Improve Road Safety Through Education and Enforcement

Goals have been set for improved Traffic initiatives, with increased traffic enforcement and regular checkstops to help combat Impaired Driving. Members will seek opportunities to conduct strategic checkpoints and partner with Traffic Services to combat Impaired Drivers and HTA Offences.

(2) Crime Reduction – Reduce Crimes against Persons/Property

Goals have been set for proactive initiatives to help reduce crimes against persons and property. Detachment members will undertake to implement additional measures to monitor persons bound by court orders to ensure compliance. Regular compliance checks are conducted on persons bound by Court Imposed Conditions to ensure compliance and charges are pursued when persons are found in breach of those conditions.

(3) Community Relations – Build and Maintain Positive Relations with our Community

Detachment Commander will ensure there is regular contact and communication with Mayor and Council to ensure any issues are brought forward and plans made to address any identified issues. Members will also seek to further engage with the Community through partnerships and engagement in Community Events. Detachment members continue to try and increase contact with the local youth with regular contact/visits made to local schools. School Liaisons have been appointed to maintain contact with Local Schools.

******The APP is the main objective, outside of responding to calls for service, of the Detachment and helps direct members efforts each and every day.******

Notable Investigations:

2026147323– Discharging Firearm with Intent – On February 2nd at approx. 8:50PM HVGB RCMP received a report of a male armed with firearm who had discharged the firearm in the street. Members from HVGB Detachment, Police Dog Services, Lab District GIS, and Sheshatshiu RCMP responded. Police Dog Services tracked the suspect to a residence on a neighboring street. A containment zone was set up, streets were blocked, and a Shelter in Place was issued. Six persons were removed from the residence and placed under arrest. A Firearm was located and seized. Drug paraphernalia was noted in the residence resulting in the residence being secured and a Search Warrant being obtained under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. During the Search a quantity of Cocaine, cash, and drug paraphernalia was seized. In total

Seven persons, 3 males and 4 females were arrested during this incident. Two persons were later released with no charges. Five others were charged including:

-38 year old Female charged with Two counts of Failing to Comply with an Undertaking

-55 year old male charged with Two Counts of Failing to Comply with an Undertaking

-23 year old female charged with Five counts of Failing to Comply with a Court order. She was held and brought before the court. She was released by the court to appear at a later date

-45 year old male charged with Five Counts of Failing to Comply with a Court Order, One Count of Possession of Property Obtained by Crime, Unauthorized possession of a firearm, Possession of a Firearm knowing unauthorized, Possession of Cannabis for purpose of selling, Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking. He was held and brought before the court and has been remanded into custody.

-45 year old male was charged with Two Counts of Weapons Possession Contrary to an order, and Discharging a Firearm while being Reckless. He was brought before the court and remanded into custody

2026152553 – Aggravated Assault – On Feb 3rd HVGB RCMP received a report of a stabbing at a residence. Members attended and assisted EMS in treating and transporting the injured male to the Hospital for emergency medical care. A 38 year old woman was arrested on scene and charged with Aggravated Assault. Police Dog Services and Labrador Forensic Service assisted in the investigation and follow up. The injured male had to be transported to St.John’s for advanced medical care. The woman was brought before the court where she was later released on conditions to re-appear in court at a later date. The female was later arrested for breaching those conditions and has since been remanded into custody.

2026173830 – Extortion without Firearm – On Feb 8th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of assault. Members attended and arrested a 33 year old woman for Aggravated Assault, Assault with a weapon, Assault, Forcible Confinement, and Extortion without a Firearm. An injured male had been transported to the Hospital for medical treatment. The female was brought before the court where she was released to re-appear at a later date.

2026193057 – Break and Enter – On Feb 12th HVGB RCMP received a report of a break and enter. Members attended and located a 43 year old male hiding in the residence. The male was arrested and charged with Break and enter.

2026210332 – Assault with a Weapon – On Feb 15th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of a Domestic Assault. Members attended and learned the male suspect had fled prior to police arrival. The 21 year old male was later located and arrested for Assault While Choking, Mischief under \$500, and Failing to Comply with a Court Order. The male was brought before the court and remanded into custody.

2026211435 – Break and Enter – On Feb 16th HVGB RCMP received a report of a Break and Enter in progress. Members attended the location and arrested a 34 year old male for Break and

Enter. The male was charged with Break and Enter and Two counts of Failing to Comply with a Court Order and held for court and has been remanded into custody.

2026267012 – Assault – On Feb 27th HVGB RCMP responded to a report of an Assault. Members attended and arrested a 28 year old male for Two Counts of Assault, Two Counts of Uttering Threats, Mischief, and Two Counts of Breaching a Probation Order. The male was brought before the court and remanded into custody.
